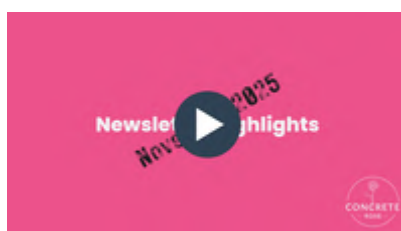

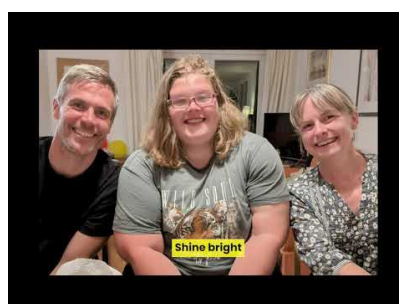
Fifth Birthday Celebration!



This month we were so proud to celebrate **five years of Concrete Rose** with some of our young people, mentors, hosts, volunteers, supporters, staff team, partners and patrons.

The focus of the evening was very much to profile the phenomenal young people we are privileged to support. As well as performances from two of our mentees, young people took a central role in hosting the evening, serving the drinks, making the food and sharing their experiences through pre-recorded video.

Our guest of honour, Ashley-John Baptiste shared his experiences as a care-leaver and a Cambridge University student and highlighted the important work of Concrete Rose in providing both accommodation and mentoring. Our founder, Mike Farrington, focussed on the unique nature of the Concrete Rose community and how creating a "professional collection of non-professionals" have allowed genuine, long-term, two-way, mutually enriching relationships to flourish between volunteers and those we support. This was summed up in a bespoke and specially crafted spoken word by one of our mentors Lee Codrington who referred to Concrete Rose as an 'Irrepressible Village' (click the picture below to listen in full):

Home cooking: Cake-in-a-Mug





Is it a volcano? Is it a monster? This is the mug cake recipe we made at The Hub! Try out this super-easy way to bake a cake with no scales or cake tins in sight - video version [here](#). **Top tip!** Either use a huge mug or do half measures - and you might not end up as messy as we did!

Ingredients:

- 4 tbsp self-raising flour
- 4 tbsp caster sugar
- 2 tbsp cocoa powder
- 1 medium egg
- 3 tbsp milk
- 3 tbsp vegetable oil or sunflower oil
- A few drops of vanilla essence or other essence (orange or peppermint work well)
- 2 tbsp chocolate chips, nuts or raisins etc (optional)

Method:

1. Add 4 tbsp self-raising flour, 4 tbsp caster sugar and 2 tbsp cocoa powder to the largest mug you have (to stop it overflowing in the microwave) and mix.
2. Add 1 medium egg and mix in as much as you can, but don't worry if there's still dry mix left.
3. Add the 3 tbsp milk, 3 tbsp vegetable or sunflower oil and a few drops of vanilla essence and mix until smooth, before adding 2 tbsp chocolate chips, nuts, or raisins, if using, and mix again.

4. Centre your mug in the middle of the microwave oven and cook on High for 1½ -2 mins, or until it has stopped rising and is firm to the touch.
